On behalf of the students, staff, and Board of Education of Christ the Teacher Catholic Schools, we pray you have a blessed Easter.


Schools will be closed from Good Friday (April 3) through Friday, April 10.


EDUCATION BACKGROUND


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Telemiracle

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
School Community Council

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
Music & Band Festivals






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
